42 Are Injured As Milwaukee **Cars** Derailed

WAUKESHA, Wis. (IP) gravel truck smashed into a train carrying 1.000 grade school children to a Mil waukee baseball game to day and knocked it off the tracks, near the village of Duplainville, 17 miles west of Milwaukee.

Forty-two persons were injured but there are no known dead. Ten of the 16 car Milwaukee Road train jumped the tracks.

A rathroad spokesman said the gravel truck passed six other trucks and went through a warning flasher system at the crossing.

It hit the third unit of the Diesel ocomotive and the lead unit of the coaches. The impact knocked over the first two coaches. The next six were piled across the track and the last two were derailed and lean-
