Ike And Estes Battle It Out In Corn Belt

By UNITED PRESS A corn-belt battle between President Eisenhower and Sen. Estes Kefauver in IIndiana attracted major nationwide attention among five state primaries today.

Other primaries in Ohio, West Virginia, Florida and New Mexio featured some hot state races. Mr. Eisenhower and Kefauver were unopposed in Monday's Maryland race and in today's Indiana primary. As a result, the President picks up 24 Maryland GOP convention votes and 32 in Indiana for a total of 56, while the Tennesseean gets 44 Democratic votes -18 from Maryland and 26 from Indiana

In addition, Mr. Eisenhower will get a bonus of 56 Ohlo votes, a!though they will be mominally piedged to unopposed favorite son Sen. John W. Bricker.

APATHY IN INDIANA Apathy marked the Indiana primary, despite its significance. There are no big contests and only 700,000 voters are expected to turn out. It is the first Midwest primary since President Eisenhower's controversial farm bill veto. Kefauver's supporters hope to make capital of this. Harnett County commissioners in a day-long session on Monday approved the request of the county board of education to set in motion arrangements for the immediate market of one million dollars remaining from the two million dollar bond issue voted last Spring for school plant building needs.

A variety of other business matters handled included the resignation of the assistant home agent, Mrs. Margaret Ray Randall, and the employment of her successor, authorization of the annual audit of county books, approval of road petitions and a preview of the county welfare budget.

State Senator Robert Morgan, attiorney for the county school board, presented the formal request for the new bond money. The resolution, passed earnier by the school board, pointed out that school con struction now underway has progressed in a satisfactory manner and "it is now desirable to let contracts for further construction in various schools.
