MIAMI (P) — Adlai Stevenson and Sen. Estes Kefauver battled today for Florida's 28 Democratic convention votes today in a primary that ranged from a light to brisk vote

The Florida votes don't add up Tuesday. to much in the convention delegate count but both candidates look upon a victory here as of tremendous psychological importance.

Dade (Miami) County reported 35,525 of its 300,000 registered voters had gone to the polls during the first three hours. This was about 75 per cent of the pace set three weeks ago when the governor and other state officers were on the ballot.

"This is a much heavier vote than we expected here," Dade predicted only 85,000 would vote in this county but at the rate they are now going to the polls we will have a total of 140,000 by tonight." BUSY TO LAST

But voting was reported much lighter in Jacksonville, Tallahassee and Tampa. Some precincts in Jacksonville and Tampa showed only 35 to 40 per cent turnout as compared to the May 8 pri-

The interest was in sharp contrast to the heated campaign conducted by Kefauver and Stevenson. Kefauver shook hands up to the last minute before leaving the state for California at 10 a m. "I've high hopes" Kefauver said at the Tampa airport while in a coffee shop. "I've been gaining strength."
