Pope Named Acting Postal Head

Thad Pope, Sr., local busi nessman and secretary-treasurer of the Republican executive committee in Harnett for more than a dozen years until his withdrawal a few weeks ago, has received word of his appointment to the post of acting postmaster.

A letter came on Saturday from Postmaster-General Arthur Summerfield. That makes Pope the favorite for endorsement as the permanent postmaster, but the presidential election is likely to intervene before the permanen appointment is made.

Pope will become acting post master, he believes, on June 30the date set for the retirement of the present head, Ralph Wade Starting salary is \$5280 annually. It will be Pope's first stint in public office since the Hoover landslide in 1928 when he went in to the elective office of register of deeds for Harnett County and served for two years.

The acting postmaster's job is full-time, said Pope today, and he plans to devote himself to it. However, Pope's Department Store will continue in business. "In the event I get a permanent appointment," Pope said, "I would of course remove/myself from my business." A permanent appointment must
