Grievous Stresses Import Peril

BLOWING ROCK, N. C. (AP) — The president of the American Cotton Manufacturers Institute called Saturday for Congress to demand a 'complete re-evaluation and rearrangement' of American foreign aid and trade policies.

KANO, Nigeria (AP) — A British airliner crashed and burned in the African forest on takeoff from Kano airport Sunday night, killing 30 of the 45 persons aboard.

Minister of Transport Harold Watkinson told the House of Commons in London that only 10 passengers and five crewmen survived the flaming crash into the trees. A spokesman for British Overseas Airways Corp. confirmed a final total of 30 dead.

The Eisenhowers will celebrate their 40th wedding anniversary next Sunday at the farm.

Pres. Secretary James C. Hagererty said the President and Mrs. Eisenhower will stay at the farm longer than just the week-end, but he did not know how long.

He said other places have been ruled out as locales for the President's convalescence from his intestinal operation of June 9.

NEHRU ASKS DELAY — Mr. Eisenhower had been scheduled to confer with Nehru in this vicinity beginning July 7.

The President met for one hour this morning with members of his staff, including a first visit from his economic adviser, Dr. Gabriel Hauge. He signed 18 congressional bills, approved a Tariff Commission recommendation and appointed a new special assistant.

The new assistant is Thomas P. Pike, now assistant secretary of defense. He will be in charge of White House Liaison with government departments and agencies.

IN HIGH SPIRITS — The President was reported in 'extremely high spirits' as he began his last week in the hospital.

Jack Spell Critically Injured

By TED CRAIL — Dragged at high speed from the cabin of a pickup truck which he was trying to enter, Dunn barber Jack Spell was in Dunn hospital today in extremely critical condition and still unconscious after 15 hours.

His wife, who had hardly moved from his bedside since he arrived at the hospital shortly after 1 a. m. this morning, said she will not leave him until he has regained consciousness.

Highway patrolmen are investigating the incident which occurred Sunday evening slightly before midnight at Baersville. Patrolman Paul Alberghine, said that Harold Strickland, an acquaintance of Spell's who lives south of Dunn on Highway 301, is presently in Dunn jail. He has been charged with hit and run driving involving a personal injury (a felony).

WIFE CRYING — The court set Strickland's bond at \$1500. At Dunn hospital, Mrs. Spell sobbed, 'There shouldn't be any bond. People should be punished for things like that.'
