(Continued from Page One) explosion was detonated. It was set off from a platform suspended beneath a 67-foot diameter balloon held captive at 700 feet. Its power was estimated as equivalent to 30,000 tons of TNT, 10,000 more tons than the force of the Hiroshima - Nagasaki bombs.
