

Braves Have Feeling They'll Win In Breeze

The Milwaukee Braves feel they'll win in a breeze, especially now that rookie Bob Hurricane Hazle is leveling a path to the pennant for them.

Hazle, a left-handed hitting outfielder brought up from Wichita on July 27, has been Milwaukee's most devastating hitter the past two weeks and now sports a .526 average with 30 hits in 57 times at bat.

Sunday he blasted a pair of three-run homers plus a single for a perfect day that powered the Braves to a 7-3 victory over the Phillies and enabled them to stretch their National League lead to 7 1/2 games.

Hazle's spectacular one — man batting show accounted for Milwaukee's last six runs. Southpaw Warren Spahn drove in the first one with a homer off loser Robin Roberts' 18th compared with eight victories. Stan Lopata homered for the Phillies.

Mueller, O'Connell Star

Don Mueller drove in three runs for the Giants with two homers and a pair of singles and teammate Danny O'Connell also drove in three runs with a homer, triple and single as five Cincinnati hurlers gave up 15 hits. Ruben Gomez pitched a six-hitter for his 14th victory, blanking the Redlegs until Ed Bailey hit his 17th homer in the ninth.

A four-hitter by Vern Law produced Pittsburgh's victory over Chicago in the opener, but ex-Pirate Dale Long, who got three of the hits off Law, also collected three more in the nightcap to pace the Cubs to victory.

MESSER TRIED

After the jury had been out 45 minutes without agreement and it appeared the case would reach a mistrial, defense lawyer Bill Taylor and acting solicitor Glenn Hooper reached agreement on a plea today in the trial of Emily and Raymond Messer.

Mrs. Messer pled guilty to careless and reckless driving and will be given sentence Sept. 5. Her husband, charged with resisting arrest and assault on an officer, Policeman J. M. Joyce, pled guilty to cursing and using profane language and to simple assault. Judge H. Paul Strickland fined him \$25 and costs.

Emmet Watson, reporter for the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, insisted that Patterson made remarks about the \$250,000 guarantee being possible only because it was raised in the South.

Dottie Will Enter Wingate This Fall

CHARLOTTE (UP) — Turning down fame and fortune, Dorothy Brown will enter a junior college at Wingate, N. C., next month to continue her interrupted education.

At a meeting here Thursday, her advisors announced that the Mooresville, N. C., girl will enter Wingate Junior College where she will take a special two-year course which should gain her a high school diploma.

Dr. Budd E. Smith, president of Wingate, said he feels that "with her maturity and intelligence" Dorothy can qualify for a high school diploma in that time.

The college's high school division has classes small enough to offer each student individual attention, and Dorothy will have special tutors in English and mathematics.

Stories written about Dorothy by a weekly newspaper editor who found her beside a backwoods well gained national attention for the beautiful and graceful girl who had little chance because of her poor family.

Dorothy, billed as a "nature girl," appeared on a national television show and received dozens of offers to cash in on the publicity. But she turned them all

down, insisting that all she wanted was an education.
