President Eisenhower said today the first of four small U. S. satellites will be fired in December with the first fully-instrument-laden sphere due to go up in March.

Meantime , Defense Secretary McElroy told his first news conference a speedup in the U.S. missile program is under consideration

Doors Locked

The President's meeting with reporters was largely dominated by the subject of the Russian satellite and the comparable American position. A few minutes before Eisenhower entered the conference, room, Press Secretary James C. Hagerty had the Secret Service and White House police seal all entrances to the room and then distributed the President's statement.

The President entered about three minutes later, made no referene to the statement and said he was ready to proceed with questioning.

A reporter jumped to his feet and said Russia had put a satellite aloft and also claimed to have fired successfully an ICBM. What are we going to do about




