The slender, neatly\_dress. ed man stood beside his at. torney, Duncan C. Wilson of Dunn, as he heard U. S. At. torney Julian Gaskill read the charges against him.

Attorney Wilson answered "guilty as charged" as Gaskill finished reading the charges .and then Jackson sat down and listened calmly with no show of emotion as the government started putting on evidence. Jackson is charged with the ac-
