


# After Chainings: 13 Children Split Up Into Foster Homes This Morning

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Eisenhower firmly assured Mayor Willy Brandt of West Berlin today that the United States will "defend" the German city against any destructive efforts of the Communists.

Brandt said he was given the assurance in a 30-minute conference with Eisenhower and Livingston T. Merchant, assistant secretary of state for European affairs.

"The President gave me the firm assurance that the United States shall defend the people of the free Berlin against any effort to destroy their freedom," the 44year-old mayor said.

Brandt said the President also told him, "No Communist threat whatsoever shall deter the United States from the discharge of its responssibilities to the people of Berlin and that the United States will not be pushed out of free Berlin."

Brandt described Eisenhower as "pleased to hear that my fellow citizens are not in the least frightened by the renewed Communist threats against their city and that they are absolutely certain that the Western Allies will stand by them."

Soviet Russia has insisted that the four-power occupation of Berlin end by May 27 with the former capital becoming on open, unarmed city under some sort of international protectorate, possibly under the United Nations.

The United States and the other Western powers have rejected the plan on grounds it is merely a thinly-veiled plot for a Communist take-over of the city.
