CARACAS, Venezuela (UPI) — Mardi Gras celebrations reached a fever pitch of excitement and violence today with serious rioting in advance of President-elect Romulo Betancourt's inauguration Friday. More than 3,000 persons went wild in the El Silencio commercial district Tuesday night.

HAVANA (UPI) — Revolutionary leader Ernesto "Che" Guevara announced that Alan Robert Nue, a former U.S. Navy pilot, would be tried on charges of conspiring to shoot Fidel Castro for \$100,000.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A Budget Bureau study showed today that, despite all budget-cutting claims, Congress last year wound up voting to spend more money than President Eisenhower recommended. Officials said the bureau intends to keep a running boxscore on this year's budget battle so the administration can "blow the whistle" on any Democratic attempt to give Congress undue credit for economy.

NEW YORK (UPI) — Ch. Fontclair Festoon, a jet black four-and-a-half year old miniature poodle, was judged best in show at the 53rd Westminster Kennel Club dog show which wound up Tuesday night before a crowd of 16,000 at Madison Square Garden. The poodle, owned by the Dunwalle Kennels of Fair Hills, N. J., promptly was retired from any further competition by trainer Anne Hone Rogers.

SURICH, Switzerland (UPI) — Greece and Turkey prepared today to put their final seal of approval on a plan calling for immediate independence for Cyprus.

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Singer Annalibera and composer-arranger Buddy Bregman were reported today planning to marry April 12.

HALIFAX (UPI) — The gray seas and freezing winds of the North Atlantic today held in their grip the fate of 48 persons aboard the missing fishing trawler, one Icelandic and the other Newfoundland. At least two other vessels were reported in trouble.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Mrs. Mamie Eisenhower and her sister are on their way today to Elizabeth Arden's health and beauty resort at Phoenix, Ark. The First Lady left Washington by train Tuesday night after a depot good-bye from the President, their son and daughter-in-law and their four grandchildren.

METZ, France (UPI) — A fire damp explosion killed five miners Tuesday in a coal mine in eastern France where 11 miners lost their lives last November.

NEW YORK (UPI) — The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People celebrates its 50th anniversary Thursday with meetings, dinners and other ceremonies across the nation.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (UPI) — Mrs. Law Pearson, 34, gave birth to her sixth set of twins Tuesday — both boys. She has given birth to 16 children in 19 years.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Rep. Glenn Cunningham (R-Ind.) says in his newsletter that Congress should be put on a five or six-day week to eliminate "Tuesday-to-Thursday's club members."

LONDON (UPI) — Professor F. C. Pybus, a leading British surgeon, warned today that smoke from burning leaves and garden rubbish are possible causes of cancer.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Eisenhower, other high officials and diplomats today inaugurate the nation's observance of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln.

HIGH POINT (UPI) — Officers and Fire Department officials today checked out the confession of a 10-year-old boy who admitted this week setting a \$67,000 school fire in July 1957. Officers said the youngster confessed to his mother during the weekend and the parents then reported the incident to school officials who brought in police and fire investigators.

RALEIGH (UPI) — State Rep. Roger Kiser, a Scotland County teacher, feels a proposed 10-million-dollar "incentive" plan to draw local support for education is a sign of a trend toward county financing of schools. Kiser, who is quick to admit he doesn't like the idea advanced by a special study commission and adopted by Gov. Luther H. Hodges, calls it more of a "goad" than an "incentive."

CHARLOTTE (UPI) — A three-alarm fire swept through three buildings on the Ervin Construction Co. property Tuesday night and caused an estimated \$100,000 damage while threatening an entire block.

ZURICH, Switzerland (UPI) — Greece and Turkey agreed today to give up their claims to Cyprus and to start work immediately to turn the Mediterranean island colony into an independent republic.

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras (UPI) — Reports from northwestern Honduras said today a force of about 1,000 rebels is advancing on Santa Rosa, capital of Copan province and chief city in the area.

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — Pope John XXIII today marked Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent by renewing an appeal for peace to "avoid suicide and homicide" throughout the world.
