The public record and the pages of history will record the successes, failures and the diligence of Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. It has already been recorded that the man in the black homburg has traveled total of 559,988 miles since he became Secretary of State.

That's a distance equivalent of 22 times around the world or to the moon and back.

But history books will not record the fact that the kindlylooking somewhat hunched diplomat ever visited the Town of Dunn because he didn't make the trip. But he almost did.

A few years ago when Jim Mc-Millan, now a resident of Raleigh, kept civic activity popping around town, he persuaded Dulles to accept an invitation to address the now-extinct Dunn Information Clinic which did bring together the late Governor Bill Umstead and his opponent, Judge Hubert Olive, for a debate which many called the turning point of that gubernatorial campaign,
