PITTSBURGH (UPI) - Jones & Laughlin Steel Corp. asked the courts today to break up mass picket lines of striking United Steelworkers which the company declared have "unlawfully" im\_ prisoned supervisory employes in three Pennsylvania plants.

The legal action, first of the six. day walkout of 500,000 basic steel workers, came as the govern. ment's top a lator, loseph F. Finnegan, was striging in New York to get negotiators for the union and industry back to the bargaining table.
