Two other drivers were afflicted mainly with damages to their cars but Ruby Stephens Moore of Route 1, Erwin, was admitted to Dunn's Betsy Johnson Memorial Hospital with back injuries. Highway Patrolman W. O. Grady

said he did not believe her injuries were serious. After investigation, Grady said the wreck had come about in

this order: Two cars had a bumping accident, one going in to a ditch. They flagged Mrs. Moore to a halt. She was hit from behind by the 17-year-old.

Grady said he was unable to determine exactly why the first two cars had wrecked. William Charles Johnson of Route 1, Erwin, 31 years old, was going west on U. The pilot was identified as Leonard Howard, of Miami. He was wounded in the leg. His co-pilot refused to identify himself, telling his captors; "First I want to talk o Fidel Castro.'

The plane was shot down around 7 a. m. while apparently on a mission to smuggle out Cubans classified by the revolutionary government as "war criminals." Four Cubans including a former police official and an army officer were captured near where the plane came down.
