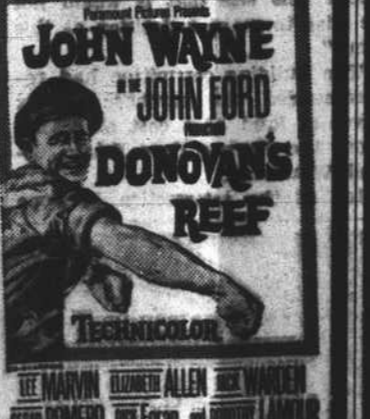

Homemakers Notes

Tips For A Busy Day

Today's homemaker is busier than the proverbial bee. She has more calls on her time for community service. She is often a working partner. She may even be among the women employed part or full time out of the home. Still, she has the responsibility of preparing good meals for her family even on her busiest days.

Many of today's homemakers, either by desire or necessity are spending less and less time in meal preparation. Streamlined menus and cooking shortcuts are the order of the day. In the desire for quick and easy, it is well not to lose sight of the fact that meals serve two very important functions in our lives: To furnish the foods needed each for good nutrition and well-being, to be a pleasurable experience shared by all members of the family as a part of family life.

Whether it is a quick-to-fix meal or one you "go all out on", the basic rules apply. Meals should be planned.
 1. In relation to the other meals of the day, to have variety in the foods used and to include all the foods needed daily.
 2. Quick and easy meals usually have fewer foods in their make-up. For this reason, more of each food should be prepared so that servings can be larger to satisfy appetites.
 3. Quick and easy meals, as with an meal, must give a feeling of satisfaction when the meal is over. Any meal must be appealing to the eye as well as to appetite if the food is to be eaten. All meals must contain food needed for good nutrition.

Quick and easy meals require planning ahead of time. That means shopping ahead. It is a good idea, when storage space allows, to keep the makings of two or more meals on hand so that you can prepare a meal in record time for unexpected guests. A supply of convenience foods is like having a "part-time cook in the kitchen".

Other ideas to save time and labor: Repeat meals which the family likes since familiarity with techniques and "when to cook what" helps to speed preparations. Be alert to short-cuts to similar dishes you prepare. You can revise many of your favorite recipes to save time and work.

Table arrangements should be attractive, but keep them and the service simple. Simplicity helps to minimize cleaning chores and laundry. Invest in some cooking utensils suitable for table service. These will eliminate extra serving dishes - and cut down on dish washing.
