## Reception For Chinese Reds Very Chilly

MOSCOW (UPI) - Soviet and inese Communist leaders, lockin an ali-out ideological battle for leadership of the Communist world, today held their first meeting in their showdown Moscow

The Chinese delegation got hilly reception when it arrived an atmosphere electrified with hostility by a last - minute ex-change of bitter charges.

The Chinese Communists and a high-level Soviet delegation went behind closed doors several hours later and met for an hour and 45

The first meeting was held in modernistic House of Receps in the Lenin Hills section of scow, where it was understood the Peking delegation will be stayduring the negotiations.


