Craig Is Named Director Of Bank

SMITHFIELD — A prominent North Carolina business and civic leader has been named a member of the general board of directors of First Citizens Bank & Trust Company.

The election of Hubert M. Craig of Lincolnton to the bank's board was announced today by Robert R. Holding, Jr., chairman.

The newly elected bank director is president of the Gaston County Dyeing Machine Company, the world's largest producer of pressure dyeing and drying machinery for the textile industry.

Craig, a past director of the Lincolnton Chamber of Commerce, has been instrumental in organizing several businesses in Lincoln County and in attracting new industry to both Lincoln and Gaston counties. He now serves as head cross director of Lincoln County, a member of the Lincolnton Library Board; and as a trustee of Mer-

dith College. Craig was formerly a trustee of Gardner - Webb College; a member of the Stanley school board; and mayor of the town of Stanley from 1936 to 1944. While he was mayor, the first water and sewer system for Stanley was installed.

Craig is a member of the First Baptist Church of Lincolnton. He has served on the General Board of the N. C. Baptist Convention; as chairman of the Lincolnton Church Board of Deacons; teacher of the men's Bible class; chairman of the trustees of the South Fork Association and president of the Brotherhood.

He is also president of Craig Realty and Development Company of Stanley; president of H. M. Craig Metal and Supply Company of Stanley; president of Surplus Products Corporation, Stanley; one of the organizers and a director of Lincoln Industries, Inc., Lincolnton; and a director of the reorganized Shorewood Furniture Company Lincolnton.

HANAU, Germany (AHTNC) — Army PFC Edward G. Marin, son of Mrs. Florence B. Westmoreland, Lillington, and Army PFC Prentice A. Yarbrough, a gunner in Company C of the 8th Division's 2d Battalion, 509th Infantry in Germany, entered the Army in April 1962 and arrived overseas the following October. He received basic training at Fort Jackson, S. C.

The 22-year-old soldier attended Fuquay High School, Fuquay Springs. His parents live on Route 8, Sanford.

Sanford Plans Labor Project

RALEIGH (UPI) — Gov. Terry Sanford said today the U. S. Labor Department had agreed to make experimental North Carolina projects in reducing unemployment a "showplace of the nation."

Sanford will discuss his proposal with U. S. Labor Secretary Willard Wirtz in Washington Thursday. He said yesterday that "more details will be announced tomorrow and additional information over the next several weeks."

Earlier, the governor's office announced that Sanford would talk with Wirtz about "retraining manpower."

"We have four or five programs in the making — our objectives to help every man and woman capable of employment to acquire the training and the skills necessary," Sanford said today.

He said "one part of our program will be a bold new approach: an experiment in which we are going to throw away the old rule book and try to write a new one."

Paving Project At Lillington

Work has been started on paving and curbing on the north and east sides of the court house.

When completed the Harnett Street between Main and First and First Street between Harnett and Front Streets will be paved and curbed on both sides.

Final endorsements of the project were secured last week by Lillington Street Commissioner A. J. White and other board members.

Property owners involved are the county, Sirena Byrd, White, M. O. Lee, W. A. Johnson, Harnett County Farm Bureau and the Morgan-Taylor law firm.

Paving will be completed after the installation of a 6-inch water main on Hammett Street. The new line was ordered by the Lillington town board at a cost of \$3,600.

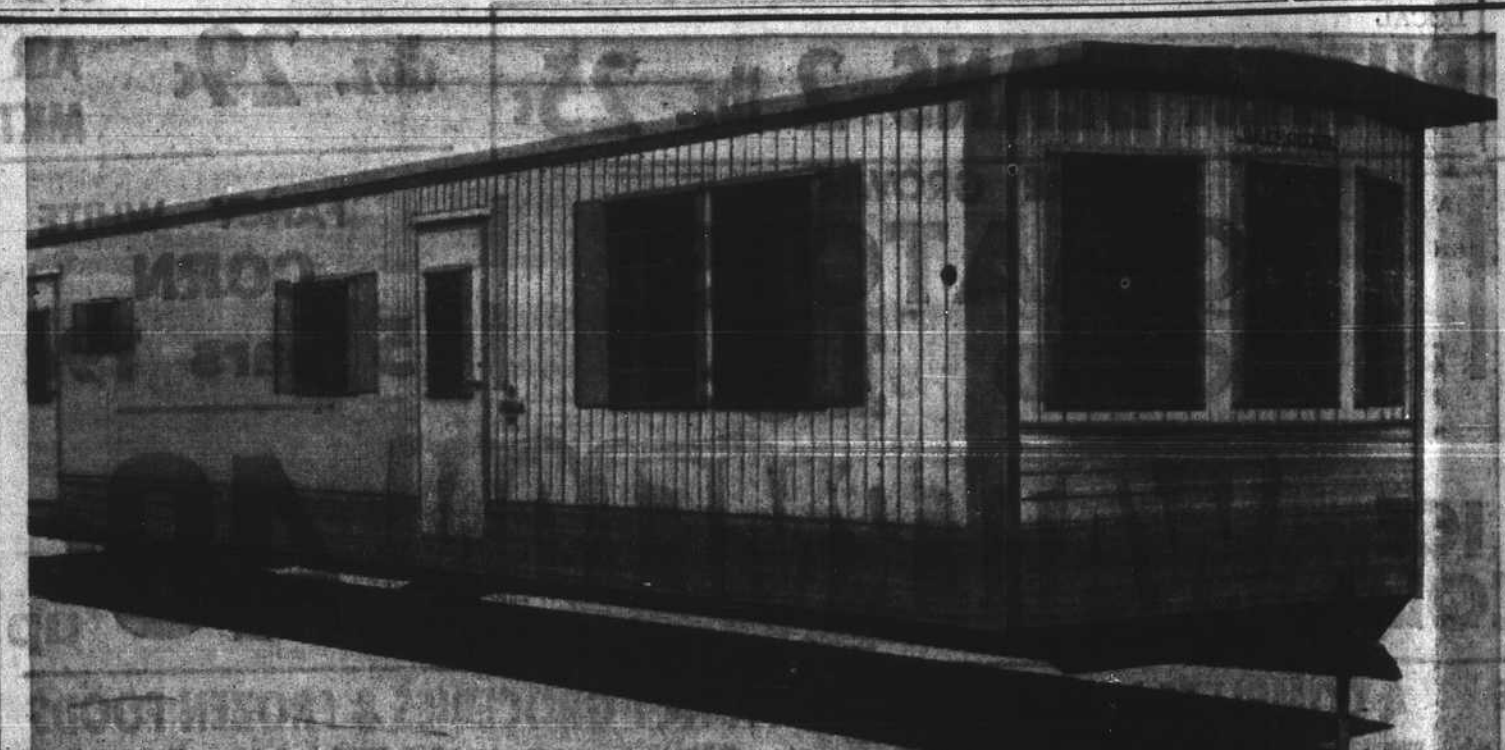
