## Peregoy Rites Will Be Friday

Death claimed the life of Charles Ronald (Ronnie) Peregoy yesterday morning at the Veterans' Hospital in Durham.  
He had been a patient there for several weeks. Death was caused by leukemia.  
The 27-year-old Dunn man served with the Air Force for nine years and at the time of his retirement last August was an Airman First Class. He had made his home here since that time and assisted his brother, Willie Peregoy, with the management of Chitara Country Club.  
He was a member of the First Baptist Church where funeral services will be conducted Friday afternoon at 2:30 with the pastor, Rev. Tom Freeman, officiating. Burial will be in Dunn with military honors.  
Born in Charlottesville, Va., he was the son of Mrs. Florence Peregoy of Charlottesville and the late John D. Peregoy.  
Also surviving are his wife, Mrs. Linda Steen Peregoy and three daughters, Pamela, Cynthia and Charlotte, all of the home; three brothers, M-Sgt. Ashby Peregoy of the U. S. Army at Ft. Benning, Ga., Willie Peregoy of Dunn and Ernest Peregoy of Charlottesville; three sisters, Mrs. Nora Shaw of Charlottesville, Mrs. Annie White of Peabody, Mass., and Mrs. W. E. Parr of Dunn.

## Four County Hesston Dealer

Four Co. Tractor Co. has been authorized as the dealer for Hesston V-22 Cotton Harvesters in the Dunn area according to Geo. F. Glover president of the local farm equipment firm.  
Hesston Manufacturing Company's booklet, "Hi-Net Cotton System," now is available free to cotton growers in this area, he added. The booklet, which presents a comprehensive program to increase net cotton profits, has been commended by educators, editors, and farmers across the Cotton Belt.  
Glover described the V-22 as a new concept in mechanical harvesting, employing brush-action to remove lint gently and deliver clean cotton. Its performance has been impressive - hundreds of fields in many states over the past four years. The two-row machine can be attached to most models of tractors, and sells for less than one-fourth the cost of most spindle-type machines.  
In competitive tests, the Hesston has harvested substantially more lint and more seed per acre, in less time than other types of mechanical pickers, Glover reports.
