LONDON (UP2) — A London newspaper said today Scotland Yard is seeking perjury and conspiracy arrests in a case involving red-haired call girl Christine Keeler and a Jamaican jazz singer who once was her lover.

The Daily Sketch said detectives investigating the quashing of an assault conviction against the singer. Aloysius (Lucky) Gordon, will nd that "a number of people" be arrested.

A spokesman for Scotland Yard onfirmed that an investigation into the Gordon case was under way. But all he would say about the Sketch report was that it was "either a good guess or a bad

Last June Gordon began a three year jail term for beating up Miss Keeler, who testified against him at his trial
