Check Contracts Advises Agent

"Better check your conservation reserve contract before planning your 1964 wheat crop," says C. R. Ammons, county extension chairman.

"These contracts require farmers to plant within their farm acreage allotments or in the case of wheat, 15 acres, whichever is larger."
According to law, to continue receiving conservation reserve payments, Harnett County farmers must comply with their contracts. Farmers with wheat allotments less than 15 acres may plant up to 15 acres without loss of these payments. However, over-planting any size allotment will reduce a farm's wheat acreage history and future allotments.
Wheat farmers who plant within their 1964 allotments will be eligible for price supports averaging 50 per cent of national parity. There will be no marketing penalty for excess wheat acreage since there will be no marketing quotas in 1964.
Farmers who have questions about their conservation reserve contracts should check with the Harnett County AEC committee.

Scout Jamboree Set For July

Harnett District Boy Scouts who would like to attend the National Jamboree next summer will have to act fast to get their reservations in, according to District Executive Dick Walters.
Walters said that the Oconeechee Council can send a maximum of 231 boys and they already have 119 paid reservations and haven't even started to promote it yet.

Over 50,000 Scouts will camp at Valley Forge, Pa., from July 17-23. Included in the eight-week trip will be Washington D. C., Philadelphia, three days in New York City and the World's Fair, the Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, N. Y., and Niagara Falls.

Boys or leaders who are interested in making this trip can get all the details this Saturday at 8 p.m. at a supper meeting at Camp Durant for prospects, their leaders and parents.
