To Be Sold

Anderson Arms Apartments, the town's only big, modern apartment house building, will be sold at public auction on Monday, Oct. 14 at noon under foreclosure proceedings instituted by Pilot Life Insurance Company of Greensboro, and The Commercial Bank Dunn.

The building was erected here several years ago by Anderson Construction Company. Pilot Life held the first mortgage but has transferred its interest to The Commercial Bank, which held the second mortgage on the property. Value of the building is estimated at from \$80,000 to \$125,000. Dunn attorney Max McLeod is representing the bank as Substituted Crustee.


