NEW WALKIE-TALKIE
WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Army demonstrated Tuesday a tiny receiver and transmitter designed to replace the old seven-pound walkie-talkie.

The receiver is worn on a helmet, and the transmitter is held in the hand, or kept in a pocket when the soldier is only listening. Both weigh less than two pounds. A 12-inch antenna of steel tape also can be fixed to the helmet.

CITES HIGHWAY SYSTEM
WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Bureau of Public Roads today credits the nation's interstate highway system with saving 8,000 lives a year, largely because of its limited intersections.

When the 41,000-mile system of super-highways is finished it should prevent the deaths of 3,000 more motorists a year, according to the same survey cited Tuesday by federal highway administrator Rex M. Whitton.

Spent Only Half Last Year

King's Group Has Income Of \$735,000

ATLANTA (UPI) — Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s integration organization had an income of more than \$735,000 during the past fiscal year and spent only about half of it.

In report of the financial status of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference today, King disclosed that the organization had a balance of \$351,922.30 on Aug. 31 from a total of \$735,534.02.

Of this balance, the organization appropriated \$383,358.94 for a legal defense fund, leaving \$351,922.30 as "net income after appropriations." The audit showed that the two largest sources of income were appeal letters and donations made at rallies. The appeal letters yielded \$231,650.10 and the rallies produced \$223,118.73.

"General contributions" produced \$204,725.00 and benefit performances by various persons brought in \$48,380. The audit also listed \$12,209.62 from churches, labor unions and fraternal organizations and \$2,712.57 from the sale of King's books.

The group spent \$40,945.20 on its mail campaign to solicit contributions and \$12,435.93 on "special promotions" for a total of \$53,381.13 for fund-raising.

This is in addition to \$11,977.64 which was listed as travel expenses for both fund-raising and "direction action."

Among expenditures were \$74,578.18 for voter registration work; \$22,583.12 for legal aid to affiliate organizations and general aid to

Plans are now complete for a Harnett County delegation to attend the School of Agriculture Open House at North Carolina State on Saturday, November 2.


E. H. Thompson, chairman of the local arrangement committee, said the delegation will leave for Raleigh about 7:30 a. m. and return about 3:30 p. m.
