**Accused Still Operators Held**

Two Johnston County men who were caught operating a cluster of four whiskey stills Thursday morning waived preliminary hearing here before U. S. Commissioner Abe Elmore and were ordered held for trial at the next term of U. S. District Court in Raleigh.

Sherwood Barefoot, 27, of Benson, Route 2, and Carlton Wade Noles, 24, of Dunn, Route 2, were placed under bonds of \$500 each, which they quickly posted.

Officers said Barefoot completed a prison term for bootlegging about a year ago.

The raid was made in Banner Township by Federal ATU agents of the Dunn office and Dunn ABC officer Falson (Red) Pope.

The officers found and destroyed three 407-gallon submarine type stills, one 90-gallon copper still, 1450 gallons of fermented mash and six and a half gallons of whiskey. They apparently had just started the run.

Federal officers participating in the raid were A. R. Bryant, R. D. Harrison, R. S. Moore, and Henry Byrd.
