Big Evangelism Meeting Is Planned Here

The Evangelism Board and the Committee on Evangelism of the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church, Inc. met in the conference office at Falcon, to map out plans for the conference wide rally and simultaneous revivals to be conducted in one hundred and fifty eight churches in the Spring of 1964.

Chairman, W. Eddie Morris presided over the session.

S. J. Williams, of Dunn is supervisor of Evangelism. This Evangelism Committee includes nine members, one from each of the districts throughout the conference.

They are: Jacksonville District, Rev. R. N. Hood, Fayetteville District, Rev. J. Doner Lee, Whiteville District, Rev. W. J. Forehand, Vanceboro District, Rev. S. L. Whitehead, Goldsboro District, Rev. Conrad N. Hall, Williamston District, Rev. H. D. Marshburn, Raleigh District, Rev. M. R. Whitefield.

The plans call for the conference to be divided into three areas. The simultaneous revivals will begin in the Southern area and embrace about one third of the churches per week for three weeks.

On Monday night, March 30, 1964 the Conference Wide Rally will be held in Wilson First Pentecostal Holiness Church. The arrangements committee, Rev. J. D. Lee and Rev. S. J. Williams of Dunn, Rev. C. L. Turpin and Charman Morris of Falcon, is to formulate the program. The plan calls for an hour radio program in connection with this Rally. Rev. W. Eddie Morris, conference superintendent was selected as Rally speaker.

The Christian Education Board and Rev. C. L. Turpin, will be co-sponsors of the Conference wide Rally. All the pastors and leaders of the churches will be participating along with the youth organization.

Barry Says Sale Of TVA Good For U.S.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., has suggested that the government sell the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) to private industry.

Goldwater said in a letter last weekend to Rep. Richard Fulton, D-Tenn., that he was "quite serious" about the proposal that the government dispose of the network on dams and power generating stations.

The GOP presidential contender said that TVA paid only a per cent of its annual gross to local government in lieu of taxes. It would have to pay five and one-half times as much if it bore a levy comparable to other taxes paid by private business, Goldwater said.

Goldwater said he believed the TVA would be better operated and would be of more benefit for more people if it were part of private industry.

Billy Raps Bigness Of Govt.

HOUSTON (UPI) - Evangelist Billy Graham, who says he has no political ambitions, Monday took a swipe at the bigness of government.

Graham, on a three day speaking tour before Houston religious and civic groups, said "our people look to the government instead of to God."

He said "it will destroy the moral fiber of our nation when our people look to the government for everything to fill our needs."

Graham was emphatic when he said he has no political ambitions because "I am not qualified and besides, nobody would vote for me."

College Benefit Dinner Slated

MOUNT OLIVE - The Free Will Baptist Churches of Sampson County have set Saturday, December 7, to hold a benefit dinner for the development fund of Mount Olive College. A goal of \$2,500 has been set for the dinner.

The Reverend Walter Reynolds, pastor of Shady Grove Church, has been elected chairman of the county steering committee. Other members include Emerson Warren and Mrs. Felton Godwin of Newton Grove, and Mrs. Eugene Jernigan and Harvey Barefoot of Dunn.

The Sampson County dinner is one of a series being held throughout eastern North Carolina to raise funds for the new 90-acre campus of Mount Olive College. Construction on dormitories, library, and classroom building are scheduled to begin next spring.

Mount Olive is a fully accredited two-year liberal arts college sponsored by the Free Will Baptist State Convention. Current enrollment is 226 students from five states.

Demo Hqs. In Miami Bombed

MIAMI (UPI) - A tremendous explosion demolished the headquarters of the Dade County Democratic Executive Committee late Monday night and a fire marshal said there was no doubt it was an intentional bombing.

Police estimates of the explosives used ranged up to 100 sticks of dynamite, apparently planted in the basement of the huge warehouse - type steel and concrete building. There were no injuries.

Texas Faces Tough Battle

NEW YORK (UPI) - If past performances are any indication, top-ranked Texas may have quite a battle on its hands when the Longhorns clash with Southern Methodist Saturday in a Southwestern Conference game.

Texas, which boasts a 6-0 record, has been rated a 19 point-favorite by football odds-makers over a Mustang team which feasts on heavy favorites. SMU already has started Air Force and Navy on successive weekends this season, and has played its best ball in the underdog's role.

Ava Is Still Shy But Can Enjoy Party

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico (AP) - A famous face appeared out of the night, just outside the restaurant window. It was Ava Gardner.

"Is this place respectable, or can any bum come in?" she asked in her throaty voice.

"Do join us, my dear," responded Tennessee Williams. "You're absolutely welcome."

Ava joined the playwright and some fellow diners at the open-air restaurant that overlooked the tropical Pacific. She wore a voluminous white serape-like robe with a bathing suit underneath. The famous Gardner legs were visible and handsome, and she was barefoot.

"I've been water skiing," she said, planning up her tanned hair. "Great fun, but I have a devil of a time getting my seat up out of the water."

Ava stayed for drinks and dinner. She and Williams discussed their favorite places in the world. Said she: "I would like to have homes in two places—London and Spain. Those would be my bases, and the rest of the time I would travel. I'm a gypsy."

Williams mentioned his fondness for New Orleans, and she admitted it was "one of the two American cities that fascinated her." "New Orleans - and San Francisco," she said.

An old acquaintance from Hollywood asked if she had lost her taste for the movie town.

"Did I ever have any?" she replied, not without a note of bitterness.

She and Williams discussed her role in "Night of the Iguana," which is filming here. He said that he was writing a new scene especially for her.

"It is something in which you will have to get your juices up; my dear," he instructed. "You can't hold back. You must give them hell."

"I will, I will," she vowed.

Shy is a word that recurs in her conversation, and it is significant in her present life. She shuns photographers and interviewers and sees only close and longstanding friends.

Charlie Campbell Now in France

U. S. FORCES, FRANCE (AH-TNO) - Army Pvt. Charlie G. Campbell, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Campbell, Route 1, Erwin was assigned early in October to the 256th Signal Company near Verdun, France.

Campbell entered the Army in March 1963 and was last stationed at Fort Gordon, Ga.

The 23-year-old soldier is a 1960 graduate of Harnett High School, Dunn.

Teams from the top 10 are involved in seven other inter-league contests, the closest of which figures to be the Big Ten battle between sixth-rated Wisconsin and Michigan State, an even-money toss-up. Illinois, No. 2 nationally, is only a 3-point favorite over Purdue in another Big Ten match.

The Southeastern Conference features third-ranked Mississippi against Louisiana State in a regionally - televised game. The Rebels are 4-point picks. Elsewhere in the SEC, Alabama, No. 4, is a 13-point favorite over Mississippi State, and seventh-ranked Auburn is 5 points better than Florida.

Oklahoma, No. 8, is an overwhelming 24-point choice over Colorado in a Big Eight contest, while Southern California, No. 9, rates 6 points over Washington in a regionally-televised Big Six showdown game.

Among the independents, fifth-ranked Navy is a slim 3-point favorite to topple Notre Dame, and the Eastern battle between once - defeated Pittsburgh and Syracuse, No. 10, is rated even. The other two major service academies, Army and Air Force, meet in Chicago before another regional television audience. The Cadets rate a one field goal advantage.
