Some To Return Within 60 Days, Says Harkins

Harkins, top U. S. military commander in South Viet Nam. said Thursday the right against the Communist Viet Cong is going so well that some U. S. troops there will be sent home within 60 days. Harkins made the statement to the Pacific Stars and Stripes news-

paper in an interview in Saigon. Harkins was quoted as saying "about 1,000 troops will be gone from Viet Nam by the end of this year." His statement confirmed the troop reduction goal announced in Washington following the visit to Viet Nam a month ago of Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara and Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of

Harkins, commanding general of the 15,000 Amercan troops serving as military advisers in South Viet Nam, said: "Victory, in the sense it would apply to this kind of war," is just months away. A total of 108 Americans have been killed in combat in South Viet Nam in the past three years and 28 others have died in noncombat accidents and from ill-

Maj. Gen. Charles J. Timmes, chief of the U. S. Military Assistance Advisory Group in Viet Nam, told the Stars and Stripes in another interview that "our job here was to train an army for the government of Viet Nam; I feel we have completed that part."

Timmes described he Vietnamese troops as being "as professional as vou can get."

Timmes said the fight against the Viet Cong insurgents possibly could be ended within a year but that he doubted it would be finish-
