# Only Minor Cases In Harnett Court

Howard Lucas, Rt. 3 Dunn white man charged with assault on Viola B. Lee pleaded not guilty in Harnett Recorder's Court in Lillington.

An array of witnesses offered conflicting testimony, and during the examination of one witness he became ill on the stand and had to be excused before his testimony. Judge Robert B. Morgan found Lucas guilty of simple assault at the end of all testimony, and judgment was continued on payment of the costs. Defendant through his attorney gave notice of appeal to superior court — no bond was required.

George (Sma) Elliott, Rt. 2, Angier, charged with assault on Lacie Melvin with a knife, had judgment continued on condition he continue to support his minor children, and pay actual costs. Traffic Violations and F.D.

Earl Linwood Tyndall, Dunn, charged with careless and reckless driving plead guilty to a lesser charge and was fined \$10 and costs, and on further condition he surrender his operator's license for a period of 90 days. Presley Mitchell, Spring Lake, public drunkenness, carrying concealed weapon—90 days on roads, suspended 12 months on payment of \$50 and costs.

On another charge of drunken driving Mitchell was ordered to pay a fine of \$100 and cost. (\$775 of fine remitted.) Justin McGregor, Rt. 2 Campton driving under influence, plead guilty to careless and reckless driving, \$25 and costs.

Gordon Keith Turlington, Lillington, speed 75 in 55 zone, not guilty.

Dennis Everett Avery, Durham, drunken driving, fail to report accident, plead guilty to drunken driving, \$100 fine and cost (50 of fine remitted).

Douglas Haire, Rt. 1 Linden, driving under the influence — plead guilty to careless and reckless driving and paid a fine of \$50 and costs.

James Wendell Cameron, Lillington, no liability insurance, \$10 and costs.

Granville Emmitt Avery, Rt. 3, Dunn, speeding and careless and reckless driving — plead guilty to speeding — not guilty to careless and reckless — to pay fine of \$25 and costs — both remitted — he is to surrender driving license.

## Aged Benefits Only Part Of Social Security

When most people think of Social Security, they think of old-age benefits payable at 62 or 65 years of age. These old-age benefits have always been the most widely known part of the Social Security program, but it is only part of the economic protection afforded by Social Security stated Charles V. Shelton, Harnett County Field Representative today.

The younger insured workers should be happy to know that their families are protected by survivors and disability benefits in case they die or become totally disabled before age 65.

If a wage earner dies and leaves a widow with minor children, his widow and children are entitled to monthly benefits. These benefits

range from \$60.00 to \$254.00 per month based upon the wage earner's earnings under Social Security. The widow would also receive a lump sum death payment ranging from \$120.00 to \$255.00. This is a one time payment and is also based upon the wage earner's earnings covered by the Social Security law.

When an insured wage earner becomes permanently and totally disabled prior to age 65, he and his family are protected by disability insurance benefits. The wage earner must have worked under Social Security 5 years out of the 10 years immediately before he became disabled. If he is insured, he can draw monthly benefits. Also his wife and each minor child can receive one-half of the monthly benefit the wage earner receives up to a total of \$254.00 per month to a single family.

So you can see that the taxes

paid to the Social Security program form the foundation of economic security for the family. Each person determines the level of protection for his family by the amount of his earnings under Social Security.

## Jimmy Gregory In Honor Society

North Carolina State's highest scholastic honor society, Phi Kappa Phi, has elected 40 students as new members. The new members include 43 seniors and six juniors. To be eligible for this national organization, the junior must have earned a 3.5 or higher grade point average with 85 credit hours. Seniors are required to have a 3.25 average with 100 credit hours. A 3.0 average equals a "B" grade average and a 4.0 a "straight A." Juniors and seniors elected to membership include Jimmy D. Gregory of Angier.
