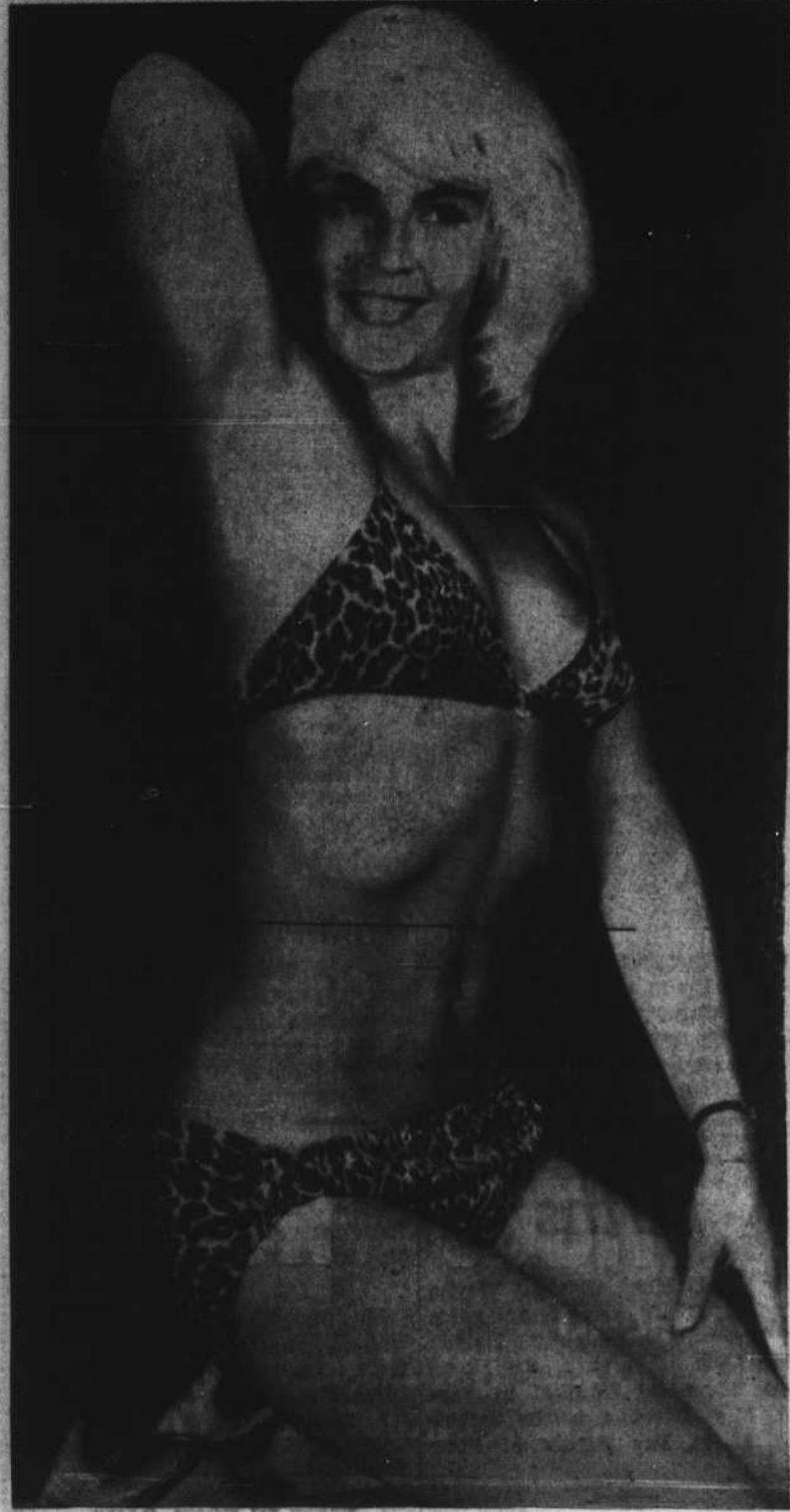


# Wrestling Returns To Dunn Friday

## Tar Heels Lose

North Carolina faltered in the final minutes and lost a wild 69-68 contest to New York University Wednesday night while the Deacons of Wake Forest avenged themselves against the VPI Cobblers 85-82.

The Tar Heels, now 10-6 in all games this season, battled from behind to tie the score at 59-59 and then traded the Violets basket - for basket until the final two minutes.

That's when Carlton Rooks and Stan McKenzie, a pair of NYU sophomores hit back - to - back baskets to lift the Violets to victory.

The Tar Heels trailed most of the game and their chances appeared hopeless when Billy Cunningham fouled out midway in the second half but the Tar Heels

fought back gamely to almost pull the game out.

Cunningham still managed to lead all scorers with 23 points in addition to excellent rebounding and fine defensive work before the home folks at Madison Square Garden.

Wake Forest's Bob Leonard and Frank Christie hit 24 and 22 points respectively to pace the Deacons to their eighth win in 17 starts this season.

The victory avenged a 77 - 72 VPI victory earlier in the season and boosted the Deacons near the 500 mark this season.

Wake Forest trailed most of the game but managed to take the lead, 68 - 66, with nearly six minutes left. VPI started a late rally that fell short because of costly fouls.
