Two Receive Road Terms

Two defendants were sentenced to the roads Friday by Vice Recorder Jesse Sherrill in Benson District Recorder's Court.
Chester McGee of Benson drew a 30-day term for public drunkenness and loitering.

Jarvis Byrd of Benson received a 30-day sentence for public drunkenness.

Paul Joseph Lane of Fort Bragg was fined \$100 and costs for drunken driving.

W. T. McLamb of Route 3, Benson, was judged guilty of three charges of driving after his operator's license had expired. On each count he was fined \$25 and costs.

Three defendants drew suspended terms.
Thaddeus Coats of Benson, convicted of public drunkenness, received a 30-day term, suspended on payment of costs.

For being publicly drunk and disorderly, J. W. Hudson of Benson was given a 30-day term, suspended on payment of costs.

Wilbert Capps of Raleigh was convicted of speeding. A 30-day road term was suspended on payment of costs.

Taxed with the costs for speeding were Julia Carolyn Peterson of Clinton, Jordan Osteneorser of Ontario, Canada, and James Herman Nordan of Lucama.

Linwood Clifton Jackson of Coats paid the costs for reckless driving.
Ransom Penny of Route 1, Smithfield, was judged guilty of assault with a deadly weapon and using profane language. He was fined \$20 and costs.

Lee W. Stancil of Benson paid

the costs for public drunkenness. Judged not guilty were Edward Jones of Four Oaks, who was charged with public drunkenness, and Aliman Leonard McLamb of Benson, who was charged with driving on the wrong side of the road.
