



In making the announcement Judge Hill expressed his appreciation to the voters for the support given him in the past and pledged that if re-elected he will continue to mete out justice "to the best of my ability."

Judge Hill, a longtime Democratic party leader and known as a hard and tireless campaigner, is a lay man who four years ago topped veteran Judge H. Paul Strickland from the bench after 12 consecutive

"The fact that I am not a lawyer," said Judge Hill today, "has caused me to work even harder to

serve the people, who knew when they elected me that I do not have a law degree. I feel that other qualifications are just as vital to this office as a law degree and I believe my record of service will bear this out." "I fully realize," said Judge

Hill, "that I have made mistakes, Judges with law degrees make mistakes, too, because it is only human to err. "But the mistakes I have made were on points of law and perhaps in judgment at times, but they were not mistakes of the heart because I have conscientiously endeavored at all times to do the right thing.
