NEW YORK (UPI) — Killer Winston Moseley showed not a hint of emotion when he was doomed to the electric chair Monday, but courtroom spectators applauded and cheered and the judge said he would not hesitate to pull the switch himself.

The outrage that was evident in Queens County Supreme Court when a jury announced Moseley's sentence was in marked contrast to the public indifference March 13 when pretty barmaid Kitty Genovese was stalked and slain by Moseley while 38 persons ignored her screams for help. No one even bothered to call the police.

Moseley, 25, a Negro former business machine operator, was found guilty of murder of Miss Genovese last week. The jury convened for 45 minutes Monday to fix his sentence. The jurors included four Negroes, one a woman.

Justice J. Irwin Shapiro hampered the bench for order when the court spectators applauded, and some cheered when Moseley's death sentence was announced. But the judge reflected similar

sentiment when he commended the jury for its "service to justice." "Although I do not believe in capital punishment, when I see a monster like this I wouldn't hesitate to pull the switch myself," Shapiro said.

Getting back to the interest rate change, which Taylor declares "is false and Rich Preyer knows it's false," he said Holding was a member of the N. C. Commission to Study Financing for Industrial Development, which made its report on Nov. 1, 1962.

"This report," declared Taylor, "did not receive Snow Holding's approval and when the commission took a vote, Holding was one of only two bankers who voted against the rate increase. And it was Nat Townsend, Preyer's own campaign manager, who all the while was lobbying for passage of a bill to raise the interest rate. He was lobbying, I am told, for First Union National Bank not First Citizens."

"No tell us, Mr. Preyer," challenged Taylor, "who represents the special interests and is special interest represented by First Citizens or Nat Townsend and First Union?"

At that point Taylor issued a challenge to Judge Preyer "or to any person he may wish to designate to debate the special interest claim at any time, any place, any date and under any format between now and election eve."
"Let Judge Preyer name the date, hour and place, let him come or let him send anybody he pleases and I'll debate the issue with him and let the people be the judge," challenged Taylor.
