RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF DUNN, N. C.
WHEREAS, on the 1st Day of July, 1964, the property owners on that portion of Moore Street from Burke Street to Granville Street, filed with the Town Clerk a petition for improving said portion of said street in the following manner: To construct an asphalt pavement 1 1/2" thick and 20 feet wide on the above described portion of Moore Street.
WHEREAS, the Town Clerk has certified to this Board that said petition is sufficient in all respects the same having been duly signed by a majority in number of the owners, who also represent a majority of all the lineal feet of footage of the lands abutting upon the portion of street above described:
NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Dunn:
1. That the above - mentioned petition is found to be sufficient in all respects.
2. That that portion of Moore Street from Burke Street to Granville Street, be improved in the following manner:
Construct an asphalt pavement 1 1/2" thick and 20 feet wide on the above described portion of Moore Street, under and by virtue of Section 160 - 78 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, 1943, as amended, and the procedure there under.
3.
