MAKING PICKLES AT HOME-Pickle products add spice to meals or snacks. The skillful blending of spices, sugar, and vinegar with fruits and vegetables gives crisp, firm tetxure and pungent, sweet-scur flavor.

Pickles and relishes contribute some nutritive value, contain little or no fat, and except for the sweet type are low in calories.

There are four general classes. Brined pickles - Also called fermented pickles, go through a curing process of about three weeks. Diled Cucumbers and sauerkraut belong in this group. Curing changes color from a bright green to an olive or yellow green, A desirable flavor is developed during curing, Fresh Pack Picklescross cut cucumber slices are brind for several hours or overnight, then drained combined with boiling-hot vinegar, spices and other seasonings. 
Fruit Pickles - Are usually prepared from whole fruits, and simmered in a spicy, sweet sour sirup. They should be bright in color, and vegetables which are chopped, seasoned, and then cooked to desired consistency. Clear, bright
