## Miss Winstead Weds Thomas Spence, Jr.

Miss Brenda Sue Winstead of Sanford and Thomas Kendall Spence, Jr., of Lawrenceville, Va., were married Saturday evening in the Jonesboro Baptist Church of Sanford.

The Rev. Mr. Robert Dillon Burch, former classmate of the groom and pastor of the South Hill Presbyterian Church in South Hill, Va., officiated and was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Gilbert W. McDowell, pastor of the bride. The service was taken from the Book of Common Order of the Church of Scotland.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Wayland Winstead of Sanford. She was graduated from Sanford Central High School and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro

where she majored in elementary education. She taught last year in the Lee County School System and will teach in Lawrenceville next year.

Her husband, son of Mr. and Mrs. Spence of Lillington, is a 1960 graduate of Davidson College with a degree in psychology. In May, he received his Bachelor of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary in Va. He is now serving as the minister-elect of Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church. He will be ordained and installed as pastor of the church September 6.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a floor length gown of white angel mist taffeta accented by chantilly lace. The fitted bodice had elbow length

sleeves and a high Italian waistline. The front panel, applied in lace, was encrusted with pearls and a triangular train of chantilly lace, bordered in taffeta, flowed from the dome-shaped skirt. Her bouffant veil of illusion was attached to a cabbage rose of alencon lace and seed pearls and she carried a cascade bouquet of gladiolus.
