ABOARD USS INTREPID

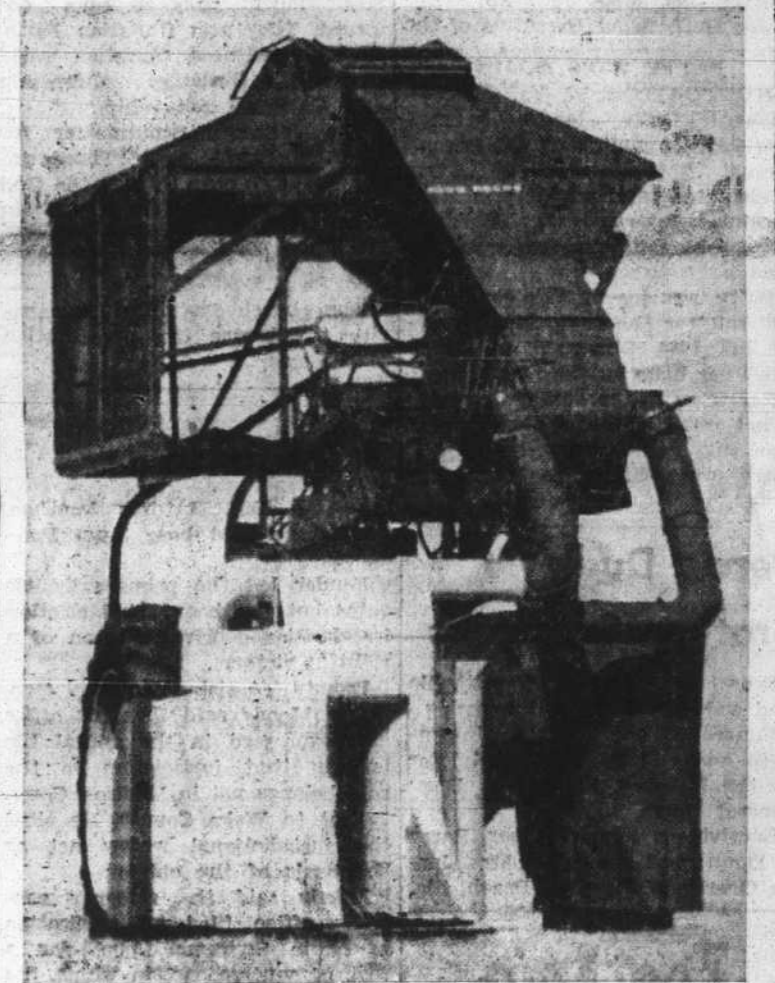

Won't Integrate Restaurant

Ready To Close

ATLANTA (UPI) — Segregationist Lester Maddox closed his restaurant today when two Negroes sought to enter.

"The Communists have put me out of business," Maddox shouted.

Maddox was directed late Wednesday to appear at a hearing next Thursday to show cause why he should not be cited for contempt for refusing to obey an earlier federal court injunction.

directing him to admit Negroes to his fired chicken restaurant.

One of Maddox's attorneys, William G. McRae, said today he had advised the flamboyant segregationist "that he should not violate the injunction."

McRae said Maddox repeated his often declared intention to close rather than serve Negroes.

"The Justice Department is very foolish to waste its money on this sort of thing," Maddox said to newsmen. "I haven't violated any court order."

"They have no grounds for such a suit unless they use lies or half truths."

Two Killed, Two Injured

RALEIGH (UPI) — Two persons were killed and two others injured today in a car-truck collision just south of Raleigh on U. S. 401.

Mrs. Lucille M. Walters, 43, of Garner and Grover Robert Parrish, 25, of Raleigh, were killed in the wreck. Both were passengers in the car.

The two were passengers in the car driven by G. T. Whaley, 28, of Raleigh, who was hospitalized for treatment of injuries. Another passenger in the car, Johnnie Willis Liggins, 23, of Raleigh, was also hospitalized.

Authorities said Whaley reported his brakes failed at the intersection of U. S. 401 South and Tryon Road.
