

# Changes Made In Benson's Faculty

Mrs. Rachel Smith Bonds, for many years an elementary school teacher in Benson, has been employed as the full-time non-teaching principal at the new elementary school at Benson.

Principal W. J. Barefoot of Benson High School said the employment of Mrs. Bonds as principal of the school at the new site was made possible by regulations recently adopted by the State Department of Public Instruction. Mr. Barefoot disclosed Mrs. Bonds' employment as principal this week when he announced plans for the coming school term. He said additional details relative to the scheduled opening of Benson schools on Thursday, September 3, at 8:30 will be given as they develop.

New teachers in the Benson High School this year and the subjects they will be teaching are: James W. Pell of Benson, science, health, and physical education; Mrs. Jacqueline Henderson of Dunn, social studies and English; and Mrs. Louise Alford Peele of Rocky Mount, English.

New elementary teachers are Mrs. Allan M. Langdon of Benson and Randolph Morgan Jr. of Spring Hope. Mrs. Langdon taught school in Benson for several years sometime ago and returned this season.

Grades 1-3 will be taught in the

new building. Grades 5-8 will be taught in the old building.

An additional course in educational television is expected to be included in the school's curriculum for high school students this fall, Mr. Barefoot said.

"The high school teachers and students are planning to continue their efforts to reach the high accreditation standards of the Southern Association of Secondary Schools," he said.

"The elementary grades already have been accredited by the Southern Association of Elementary Schools," Mr. Barefoot said.

He said a regular decrease in the enrollment in the elementary grades for the past several years has resulted in the loss of teachers in those grades.

He said Mrs. Rosalyn H. Ryals, who was serving as principal of the primary school, resigned in the spring.
