## Neat Tricks

Pluff sweet potatoes with butter and canned apple sauce. Put back into the shells and brown in broiler.

Treat outdoor furniture with a wood preservative to add years to its life.

Discourage silverfish on shelves by washing with a borax solution and sprinkle a little borax on the back of the shelves.

Use a moth ball as the center to wind a hank or yarn into a ball to store.

Use paper clips to hold plastic material instead of basting which will leave pin marks.

Rhinestone buttons and buckles will sparkle if soaked in liquid detergent for about 15 minutes and then rubbed with a flannel cloth.

For a summer treat, try lemon sherbet with chilled canned apple sauce.

Use a quick application of clear nail polish on an envelope flap when normal adhesive doesn't stick.

Rub white vinegar on the mark left on dresses when the hem is lowered. Then press out with a warm iron.

Sew through a blotter to absorb grease on a freshly oiled sewing machine.

When putting a patch on pants or on a sleeve, open the seam and sew the patch on a smooth surface.

Put paper dollies between stacked plates and saucers of fine china to prevent scratches.

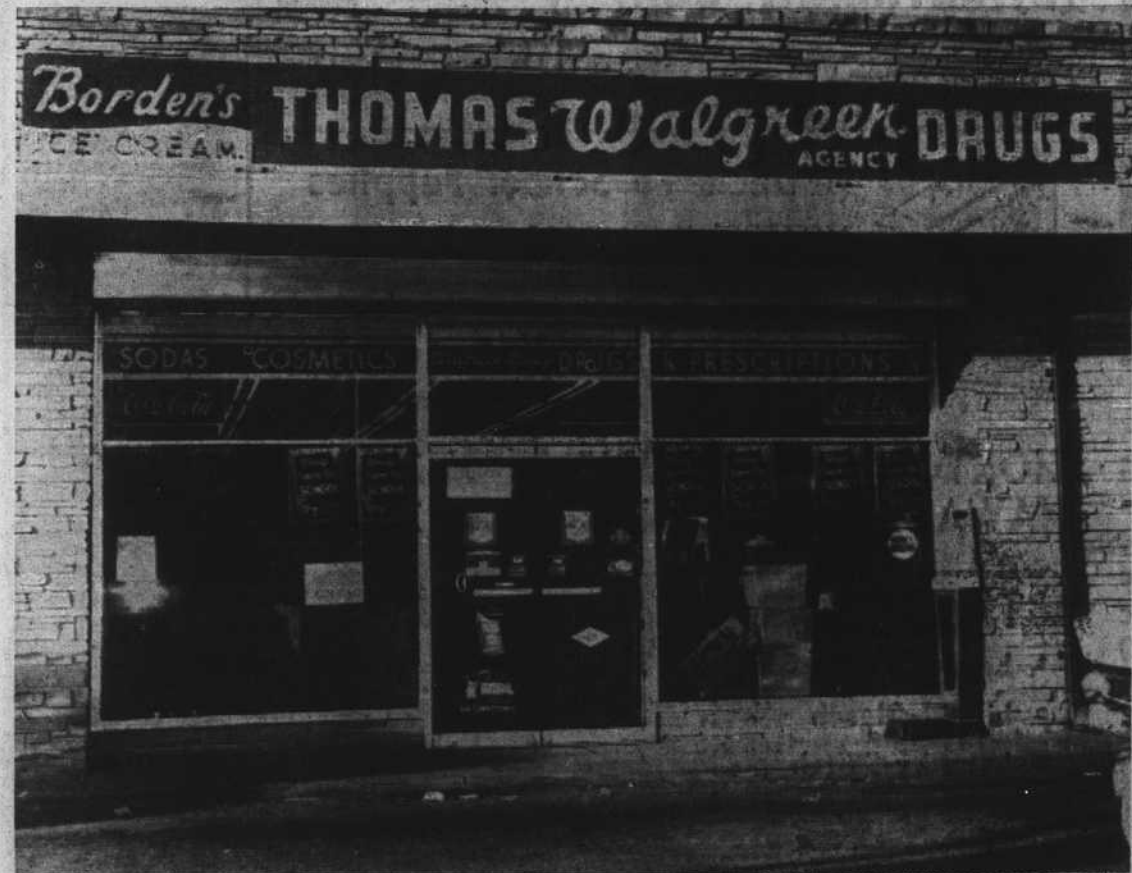

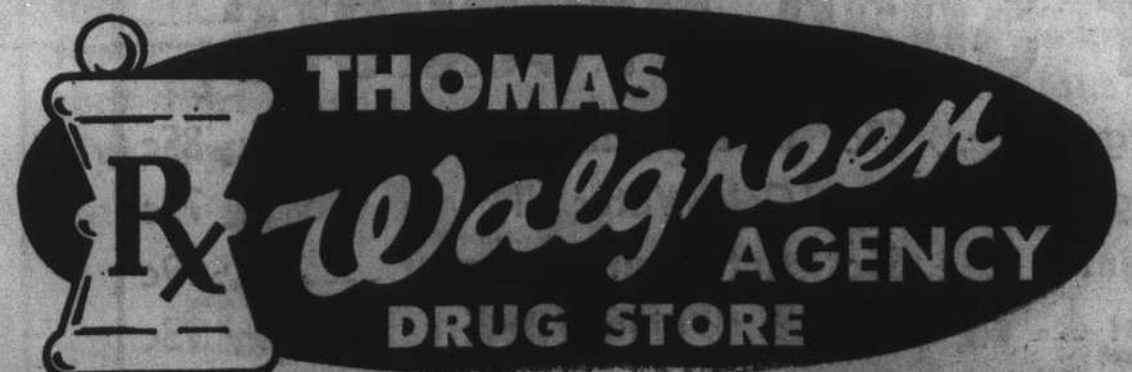

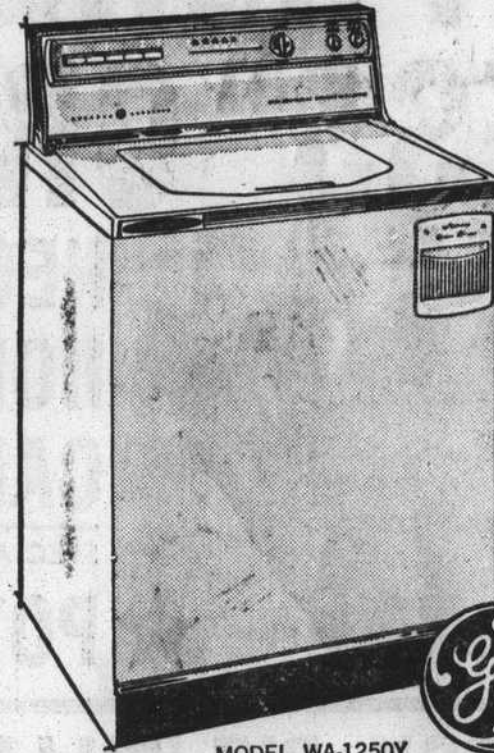
