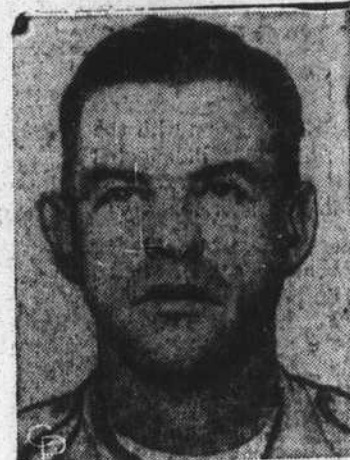
Mrs. J. D. Lee Is Circle Hostess

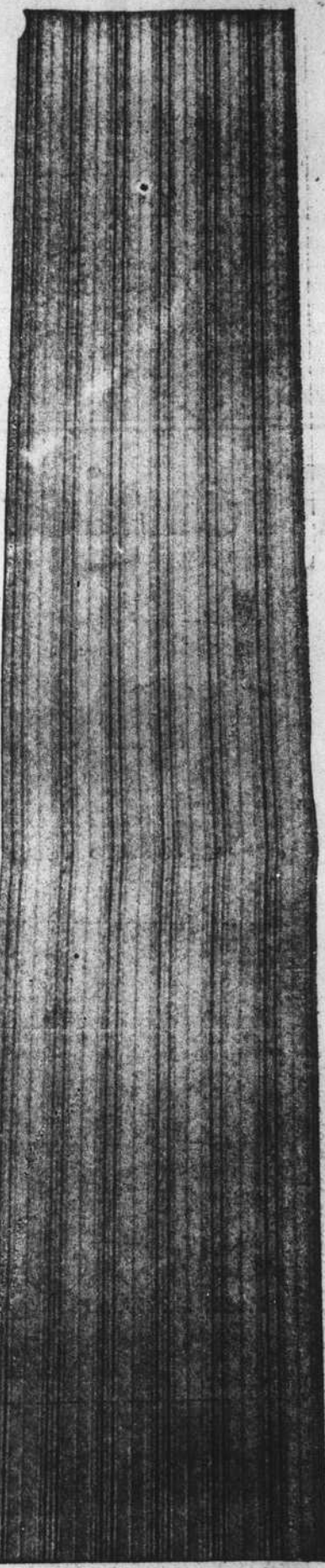
