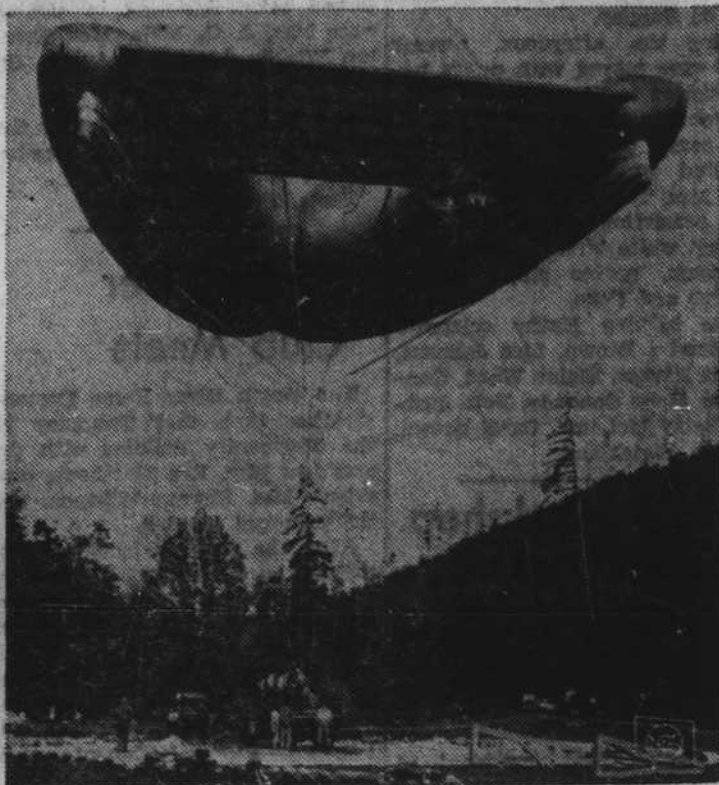


No Kidding, Folks, It Is a Sky Hook!

Girls Fined For Wearing Topless Suits

LONDON (UPI) — An indecent exposure conviction of two London singers, who appeared at a film premiere in topless evening dresses, was upheld by an appeals committee.

The girls, Marion Mitchell, 23, and her sister, Valerie, 21, were fined \$44.10 each.

Appeals Committee Chairman R. E. Sexton said he was reminded of an old music hall song which went: "Imagine mother with her legs all bare, bathing in the fountain of Trafalgar Square."

"There were things that could be done at the seaside but not in town," Sexton said, referring to the incident which occurred on July 8 at the premiere of the film, "London in the Raw."

The girls arrived at the premiere wearing evening dresses with fur wraps over their shoulders, a police officer said.

He testified that the girls left the car and dropped their wraps and showed that they were wearing topless dresses.

The officer said the assembled crowd gasped.

Defense attorney James Burge contended that what was wrong in the age of crinolines and bustles was not necessarily wrong today.

It was merely "a question of lowering the bust line," he said.

The home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Nordan in Angier was burglarized by a still unknown person.

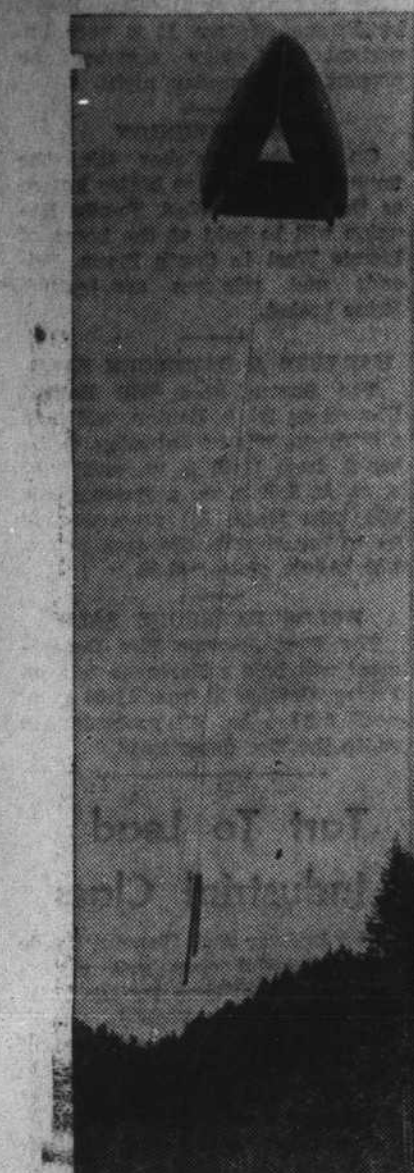
The thief broke a storm door to enter but went to another door where he got in by tearing the screen.
