

Two Arrested Had Arsenal Third Sought

CORPUS CHRISTI, Tex. (UPI) A reported threat to assassinste President Johnson led sheriff's deputies Tuesday night and today to an arsenal including weapons as big as a field mortar and a collection of Nagi renes.

The deputies arrested Julius Schmidt, 29, a plumber and gun trader, and another unidentified men who worked on guns. Deputies and polic still sought the man who made the reported threat - a former mental patient believed to be in the Corpus Christi area.

"I do not believe there was a plot to kill the President, but I do think that one individual made such a statement to kill the Presdent to an informant I trust 100 percent," Sheriff Johnnie Mitcheil said today.

President Johnson is due in Corpus Christi Sunday to make a campaign 'speech.

Two Not Involved Mitchell said Schmidt and the other man arrested were not involved in a plot. He said his informant told him that the man who threatened the President intended to buy a gun from Schmidt but had not made the at-

Schmidt was arrested to cut off the man's "scource of supply." Mi_ tchell said the man wanted a "fully automatic weapon" and he
