Mrs. Nathan M. Johnson, Sr., and Mrs. J. Lloyd Wade will be hostesses to the members of the Virginia Dare Chapter, Daughters of the American Colonists on Wednesday. The meeting will be held at the Woman's Club at 11:00 am with luncheon following the business session.

The Daughters of the American Colonists was organized in Washington, D. C. in 1901 and in North Carolina in 1926. There are now 48 state societies with membership of 13,000. North Carolina has membership of 500.

The objects of the society are patriotic, historical and educational: to make research as to the history and deeds of the American Colonists and to record and publish the same; to commemorate deeds of colonial interest, to inculcate and foster love of America and its institutions by all its residents; to obey its laws and venerate its flag - the emblem of its power and civic righteousness.

Many national awards are given each year through air training programs. Patriotic education is stressed. Outstanding work is done by members for rehabilitation at veterans' hospitals.

Eligibility for membership in the Daughters of the American Colonists is based on lineal descent of a man or woman who rendered civil or military service in any of the colonies prior to July 4, 1776. It is not a political organization.

Mrs. R. L. Brinson of High Point, regent of the Virginia Dare Chapter, will preside.

The honorable Robert Burren Morgan of Lillington will speak at the luncheon session.
