

Man Receives Two Road Terms

Roy Thomas Sneed of Benson was committed to the roads for a total of 60 days after being tried Friday before Judge C. P. Trader in Benson District Recorder's Court.

Sneed was found guilty of two public drunkenness charges and

in each case drew a 30-day sentence, suspended on payment of costs. He was unable to comply with the judgement and was sent to the roads.

Thirteen defendants were handed suspended terms.

Robert Lee of Four Oaks was convicted of reckless driving and driving without an operator's license. He received a six-month road term, suspended on payment of a \$50 fine and costs.

Jesse Lee Burwell of Garner

was found guilty of driving without an operator's license and possession of illegal liquor. A 60-day road sentence was suspended on payment of a \$35 fine and costs.

Pearl Woodall of Four Oaks was judged guilty of larceny. The defendant was handed a 60-day sentence, suspended on payment of costs, including \$15.70 to the prosecuting witness.

Talmadge Winston Walton of Varina, convicted of improper parking, drew a 30-day road term, suspended on payment of costs.

Six defendants were found guilty of speeding with each receiving a 30-day road sentence, suspended

on payment of costs. They were: Francis L. McCormick of Massachusetts; Reulah Rokeach of New Jersey; Eddie L. Washington of New York; Ronald Allen Harvey of Georgia; Bernard Hayes Lowery of Pembroke; and Jordan Deans of Rocky Mount.

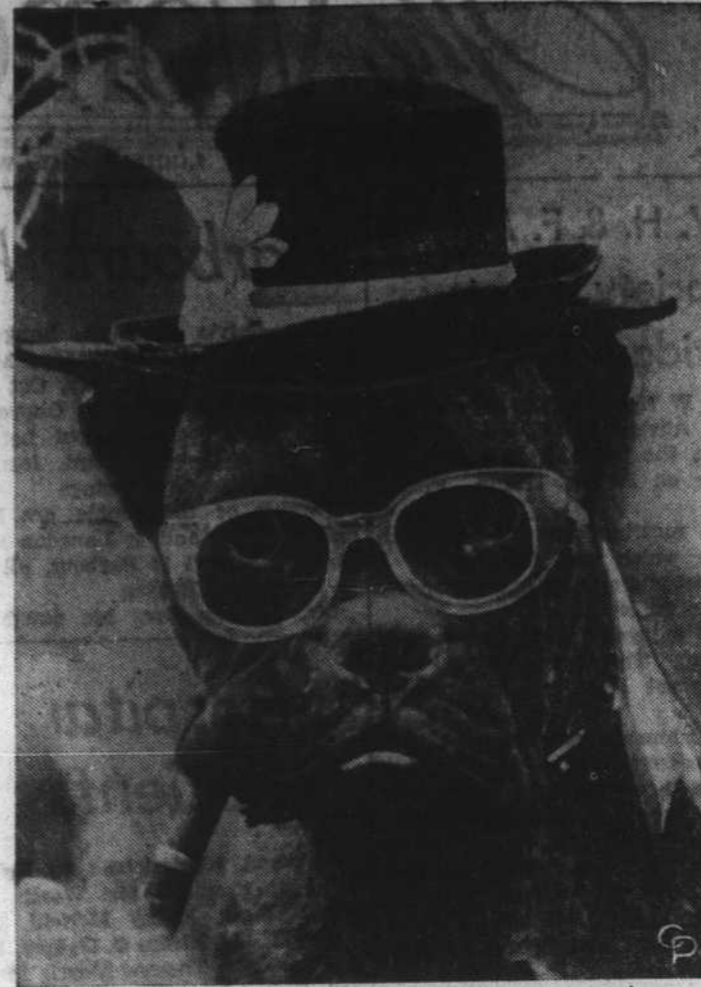
Three defendants were judged guilty of public drunkenness with each drawing a 30-day road term suspended on payment of costs. They were: James E. Gilbert of Benson; Charles Byrd of Benson; and John L. Grimes of Benson.

In the case against Willie Lee Strickland of Benson, who was charged with assault with a deadly weapon, the court held that the prosecution was frivolous and ordered that the prosecuting witness be taxed with the costs. The same entry was made in the case against Freddie Strickland of Benson, who was also charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

Judged not guilty were Jesse Lee Solomon of Garner, who was charged with possession of illegal liquor, and Russell State of Benson, who was charged with being drunk and disorderly.
