Letter To The Editor:

TO THE EDITOR:

Come November we are called upon to make a decision between 2 of 4 men, each different, who talk much but have not given or presented or uttered much of a fixed, basic or definite program or policy for the solution of present or future problems at home or abroad. It is a sort of popularity contest and we must take them with faith and hope that perhaps things will work out for the best. To many it seems that here is no much in the way of an ECHO or CHOICE and to others any kind of change could not be worse, and this at a time when the world is in a Revolution of change and uncertainty and a fixed, basic, definite and essential program and policy seems necessary everywhere to fit today and tomorrow. The whole world is in a Mess due in a large measure to the failure of leadership and proper planning.

Politicians, writers and news media say much about peace, experience, responsibility which are more myths and prosperity wiped out by inflation, but offer us little or nothing in the way of a debate or discussion of any solution of the many and varied problems we face everywhere. We are left with a sort of solution by trial and error. It seems that for some 30 years we have been following false prophesies or hypocrites, and we are reaping the harvest: Examples the farm programs and some 40 welfare agencies or bureaus, with the result that a war on poverty is immediately necessary, along with Sanford's 4 year war in behalf of quality education. Uncertain, vacillating and changing leadership has been the order of the day and even now we have no firm, fixed, definite, basic, and certain policy or program, with the result that we are fast reaching the whirlwind of indecision from the day to day handling of the situations as they appear. Thus the bomb and space age caught us unprepared and will likely overwhelm us in the matter of expense and management and control, much of which is beyond direction and control, and may destroy or exhaust us ultimately.

Our button pushing talk reminds us of the play "Who Has The Button" We have long since passed the time of one man pushing the button, since Russia and France and now China all have buttons which they can push at their will. It is worth mentioning that one man button pushing is frightening and seems to give one man the power to "Hold The Whole in His Hands" Further our own button pushing is more or less a delaying or rear guard. We have more or less practiced co-existence accommodation and trading with the enemy or competitor, in the hope that the evil day will be postponed or fade away. While the USA and Russia had the Monopoly on Bombs and Space,

each have sought by favors, loans and money as sole competitors to dominate, direct and control the whole world and at times as a sort of blackmail with USA and Russia in control it was a sort of "rat race" but, with the addition of France and China it has become a nightmare. Some new way must be found that nations may live in peace and harmony and money and blackmail and force is not the way. The solution more or less lies in the realm of spiritual values and love and respect.

The 4 men offer us little more than platitudes, multiple promises, name calling, criticism, ridicule, character, morality principle, hate, fear, many scandals, big government, debt, deficits, more welfare, higher wages and prices, more programs, etc. We make war on poverty and talk about quality education, but say little or nothing about gambling, whiskey crime or welfare upon each of which we spend more than we do on education.

Let me remind you of a story that Gov. Vance often told about a man drunk riding down the mountain with a run away team, crying out to all and sundry to head them off.

CLEVELAND, Ohio (UPI) — Nobel Peace Prize winner Martin Luther King Jr. said here Friday 98 per cent of America's Negro voters will vote against Sen. Barry Goldwater.

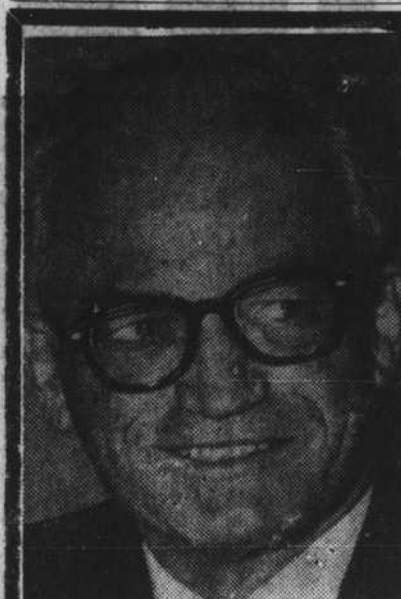
King, a leader in the civil rights cause, said the vote against the Republican presidential nominee will be "not because he is a racist himself but because his philosophy gives aid and comfort to racists."

"The Negro vote can be the deciding force in the election," he said in an interview before his tour.
