Job Will Be Done In Three Stages

Plans Given For Taking Ag Census

Plans for taking the 1964 Census of Agriculture in Hatteras County were announced today by A. J. Stephenson, Jr. and Rev. Sam P. Hudson, newly-appointed census crew leader by the county. The job will be done in three stages, the crew leader said. First will come recruitment and training of enumerators to count all farms in the county. About one enumerator for each 150 farms will be needed.

member 23. Enumerators will take about three weeks to complete their work, the crew leader estimates.

The Census of Agriculture is taken every five years in the years ending in "4" and "9" to gather up-to-date information on the nation's agricultural resources and production. Such information is vital in making decisions affecting many segments of the U. S. economy. Data gathered include the number and size of farms, acreage and harvest of crops, livestock inventory, information on farm equipment and facilities, farm products sold, and use of fertilizers, insecticides, and herbicides.

GOTTON BALES BURN

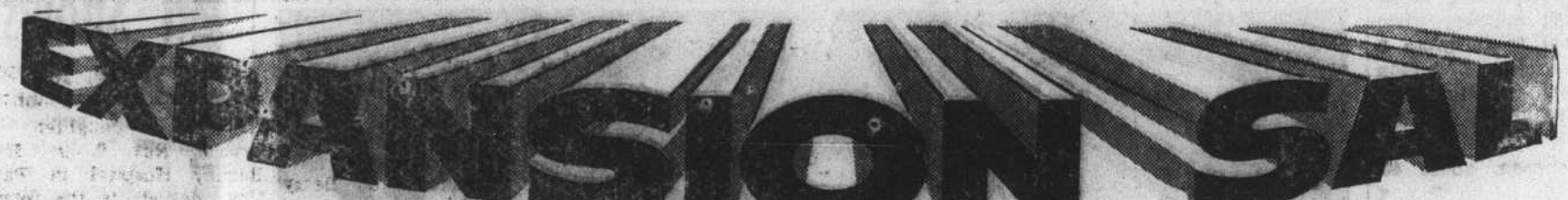
