## Letter To The Editor:

**TO THE EDITOR:**

Tobacco like all goods and merchandise to be a success story should produce and offer for sale a better and better satisfying product that will meet the ever changing needs and demands of a changing and growing society, and likewise industry must manufacture a finer and finer package for sale that will satisfy and increase the demands and bring sales in line with the ever improving economy and thus increase production and lessen surplus.

The present program is a proven failure in the matter of preventing a surplus of nondescript grades, and so the future of tobacco is in danger and some better plan is required. The failure is due in part largely to: 1. Speculators seeking a fast buck. 2. To growers planting low quality types. 3. To the high chlorine content of fertilizer used. 4. To use of excessive chemicals that contribute to the cancer scare. Many feel that growers are producing surplus for storage at the fixed prices.

The allotments have continued until now about half of the growers are in the 2 acre or less class, and about an additional one fourth are in the 5 acres or less class and so we now have about 75% ginal growers who are poor candidates under the formula of the great society. An ugly piece in the eyes of marginal farmer and the "Have Nots" and so we have the cry for change from those that have.

It is time for growers and dealers and industry and politicians and agencies to stop infighting and face the plain hard facts about tobacco and its problems, and unite and join together in some serious way to work out some solution that will save the industry. They should begin with the reduction of high producing low quality types and the limitation of chlorine content of fertilizers and the excessive use of chemicals, to the end that a better satisfying product may be

produced that will meet the growing demands of economic growth and at the same time bring production in line with increasing supply and demand. Otherwise we should return to an open production under the free enterprise system and stop complaining or ask congress to save the growers and the industry.

The question will ever remain quality production.
