PLYMOUTH (UPI) - "Extra" highway patrolmen were arriving in Plymouth today as Negroes and Ku Klux Klansmen both planned night rallies.

Trial was set in Superior Court for four persons facing charges which grew out of racial disturbances in Plymouth almost two weeks ago

In still another development, the Rev. Raiph D. Abernathy, a top official of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, was to meet with D. S. Coltrane, the state's top racial troubleshooter. Coltrane, chairman of the State Good Neighbor Council was expected to urge Abernathy to hold off any civil rights demonstrations. Abernathy scheduled a news conference at 4 p.m.

Highway Patrol Commander Col David Lambert said "extra patrol assistance is being sent into the Plymouth area to aid local law enforcement officers in the event they are needed."

Negroes scheduled a rally at a local church while the Ku Klux Klan planned to meet nearby in rural Washington County.
