# Dunn Notes Sold At Inree Units For Assault Low Interest Rate

sion has sold \$475,000 in Town of Dunn water bond anticipation notes to First Citizens Bank & Trust Company at the low inter. est rate of 2.7484 per cent.

Interest on the Dunn bonds was among the lowest in issues totaling \$1.26 million by the com-mission for the towns of Southport, Mount Olive Conover and for the County of Moore Ouly the More County notes sold for less 2.43 per cent. Southport bonds, for instance, sold at 4.065.

This is an indication of the good financial condition of the

Town of Dunn.

bonds at 2 78 per cent, and Wachovia, the only other bidder, of-fered 3.07 per cent.

These shrot-term notes will be paid off on March 14 when the Town of Dunn will issue and sell bonds for theb watr improvements eand also for the new hospital.

The short-term borrowing enables the town to go ahead with the work before bonds are sold.

### Says Conference Might Possibly Result In Peace

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (UPI) - Britain today proposed that both sides stop fighting and end interference in Viet Nam, then join in a conference "under whatever auspieces might promise success."

"From that," British Foreign Secretary Michael Stewart told the General Assembly, "Let us get a situation in which South Viet Nam, and North, is firmly guaranteed against attack. Let us have a program of rehabilitation, administered by the United Nations, to repair the ravages of war."

Britain and the Soviet Union are co-chairmen of the 1954 Geneva Conference on Viet Nam which many countries have demanded reconvene. However, Stewart did not limit his call for negotiations to

He said a Commonwealth mission, spurned by the Communists, stood ready to go to North Viet Nam and Communist China "as soon as those doors are opened."

Negotiations, Stewart said, "can create the conditions in which governments can emerge in South and North Viet Nam) truly representative of their people; in which South and North shall be completely neutral, with no foreign troops or bases and able by their free choice to determine their future relationship to each other.
