The princess wore a floor length turquoise evening gown at the "informal" party in the chic Four Seasons restaurant. She declined the frug and the jerk for "sedate fox trots" and a "graceful Charleston" and danced frequently "with anyone who asked her, a spokesman said.

The princess and her husband, Lord Snowdon, arrived at 11:12 p. m. in a racing green Rolls Royce. More than 300 persons, many of them British, braved the night chill to cheer and ooh and aah as the royal couple entered.

Nearly 200 of the door-watchers remained until 3:19 a. m. when the royal couple, grinning broadly, left for the Long Island estate of John Hay Whitney, former U. S. ambassador to Britain.

A member of the royal entourage declared the princess four hours of dancing and chatting and pick-

ing up her own supper buffet-style in the restaurant's gleaming kitchen constituted "the time of her trip."

**Likes "Theatrical People"**  
A spokesman said the princess "felt at ease because she was with theatrical people." Averaging three partners per number she danced with numerous show business luminaries, including Sammy Davis Jr., Leonard Bernstein and Harry Belafonte.

New York Mayor - Elect John V. Lindsay had a "serious" 15-minute talk with the princess, spokesman said. Both he and Lindsay declined to disclose what was said.

The princess and her husband had no official engagements scheduled before their departure to Bermuda on a first class BOAC flight at 3:15 p. m. EST.

The royal couple planned to leave Bermuda for London five hours later in a divan-fitted first class compartment of a regularly scheduled BOAC flight.

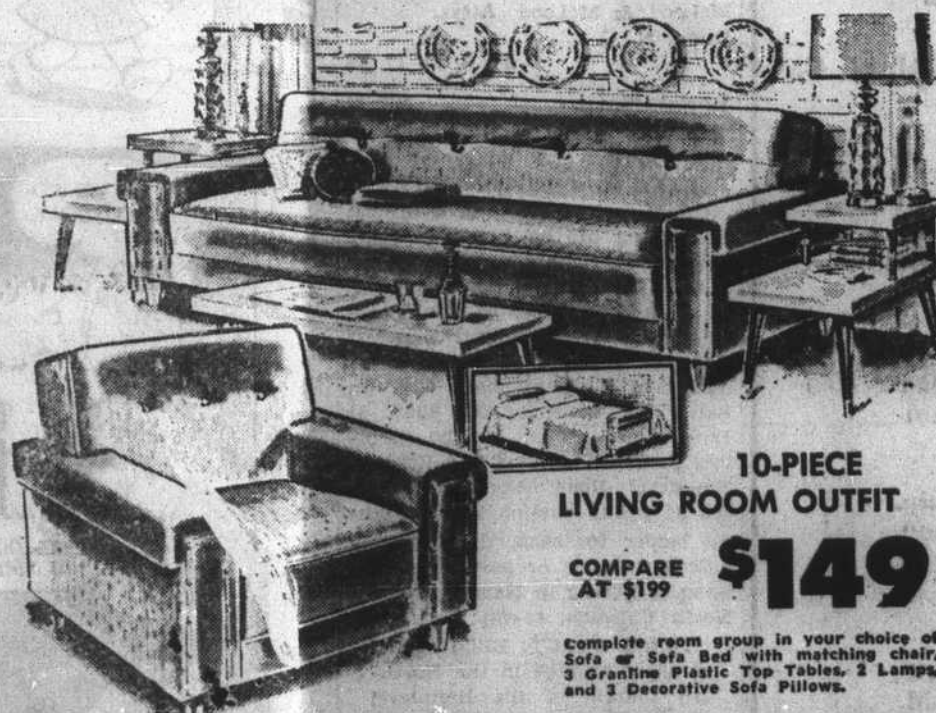
