Charters Fare

One Half

Effective January 5,1975, Eastern Airlines will inaugurate a new charter service priced approximately onethird to one-half below daycoach fares.

Jeff Dishongh, Eastern's vice president-passenger sales, said the charters, to be operated with Boeing 727 Whisperjets, may originate in any U.S. city with an adequate airport, east of San Antonio, Omaha and Minneapolis. In addition, he said, they may originate in the Canadian cities of Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto and the Bahamian cities of Nassau and Freeport.

Called Starlight Service Charters, the new service will be available to affinity groups such as clubs and organizations other than those set up especially for travel. Single entity groups such as those formed by a corporation giving incentive trips to employees or free travel to customers as contest awards may also take advantage of the reduced fares
