The middle income family (averaging \$14,000 dollars a year), will receive about a \$253 dollar tax cut, this rebate will just about cover their increased energy bill. and provide them with \$20 to the good. The high-income family (averaging \$24,500 dollars a year) and receiving bout \$183 dollars in tax reates, will have to pay an additional \$50 dollars in cash o cover their increased nergy costs.

.Remember, all of the above ccurs if the President's guess s correct: that the cost of energy per family, under this olan, will represent an increase (as a low estimate) of bout \$233 dollars.

.If the \$233 dollar figure is ncorrect, and if the President's nearer the mark, then all income levels will be in trouble, because the proposed ax rebate will not absorb their energy cost increases at all. Low-middle families will have to give up their rebate to the energy industry, and add \$34 dollars, middle income
