

Federal Income Tax Rebates Will Mean Less Money In Your Pockets

If you are planning on spending your 1974 tax rebate, you'd better wait and find out how high your gasoline, heating, electric and food bills are going to be in 1975. According to President Ford's aides, the Ford plan for stimulating the economy and for decreasing energy consumption will end up cutting most of our incomes, because energy costs will be higher. They're arrived at this ominous conclusion by projecting a per family estimate for the increase of energy costs under the President's plan. The low estimate increase in energy costs will be about \$233 dollars per family for 1975, the high estimate project is estimated at about \$345.

A low-middle income family (averaging \$8,000 a year) will receive about a \$311 dollar tax cut, this rebate will cover their increased energy costs, and leave them \$78 dollars extra. The middle income family (averaging \$14,000 dollars a year), will receive about a \$253 dollar tax cut, this rebate will just about cover their increased energy bill, and provide them with \$20 to the good. The high-income family (averaging \$24,500 dollars a year) and receiving about \$183 dollars in tax rebates, will have to pay an additional \$50 dollars in cash to cover their increased energy costs.

families will have to add \$92 dollars, and high income families will have to add \$162 dollars to their respective tax rebates to pay for the extra energy costs.

In all the President's plan which purports to have as its purpose, the restimulating of the economy in terms of con-

sumer purchasing power and increased industrial production, will have as its net effect, the further saddling of this nation with deeper inflation and deeper recession.

This situation is clearly inflationary, and will not only continue last year's 12 percent inflation rate, but will pro-

bably raise this rate because the spin-off factors are unknown. It also represents an interesting facet of the Administration's view, because it demonstrates that the Administration's concern over factors leading to inflation, are conditioned by their own purposes.
